MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING READ AND APPROVED:

1. DR. ADAIR DISCUSSED THE PROBLEMS HE HAD BEEN HAVING WITH THE PROPOSED CLARK MEADOWS NURSING HOME ON ST. ROAD 62 AND IT WAS GENERALLY FELT THAT THIS HOME SHOULD NOT BE ALLOWED TO OPERATE, UNLESS IT MET ALL STATE REQUIREMENTS.
2. THE OAK PARK WATER SITUATION WAS DISCUSSED AND DR. ADAIR TOLD THE BOARD THAT THE WATER TABLE HAD BEEN DROPPING AND THAT THE HANGER WELL WAS NEARY, BUT THERE WAS NO SOLUTION FOR THIS AT THIS TIME.
3. THE AIR POLLUTION IN CLARK COUNTY WAS DISCUSSED AND DR. ADAIR TOLD THE BOARD THAT HE FELT A STUDY SHOULD BE MADE WHEN THE ORDINANCE WAS COMPLETED.
4. DR. ADAIR TOLD THE BOARD OF THE FILTHY MESS HE AND THE SANITARIANS HAD ENCOUNTERED AT THE DANCE TRUCK STOP FOOD SERVICE CO. AND STATED THAT IT HAD ALSO BEEN INSPECTED BY A MEMBER OF THE INDIANA STATE BOARD OF HEALTH AT INDIANAPOLIS, WHO HAD MADE RECOMMENDATIONS.
5. THE LINCOLN HEIGHTS SEWER PROBLEM WAS DISCUSSED AT LENGTH, BUT NO ACTION TAKEN AS YET.
6. THE GREAT NEED FOR A DOG POUND WAS DISCUSSED AGAIN AND DR. SPIETH STATED THAT IT WOULD TAKE QUITE A BIT OF MONEY TO BUILD AND MAINTAIN A DOG POUND. IN CONCLUSION, IT WAS AGREED THAT DR. ADAIR GET SOME SUGGESTIONS FROM THE STATE BOARD AT INDIANAPOLIS, ALONG WITH PLANS.

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

A SPECIAL CALLED MEETING WAS HELD JUNE 6, 1966. AT THE REQUEST OF THE PRESIDENT, MR. HERMAN MILLER. THIS WAS TO DISCUSS THE REGINATION OF MR. ARTHUR REICHLER AND MR. CARL J. COOMBS, SANITARIANS.

PRESENT WERE: DR. ROBY
DR. BOWER
DR. RALPH BRUNER
DR. SPIETH
MR. HERMAN MILLER

A DISCUSSION WAS HELD REGARDING A REPLACEMENT FOR MR. CARL J. COOMBS. MOTION BY DR. BOWER AND SECONDED BY DR. BRUNER AND CARRIED; THAT MR. FRED TAYLOR, REGISTERED SANITARIAN FROM JEFFERSON COUNTY KENTUCKY, BE CONTACTED FOR THE VACANCY. ALSO THAT HE BE OFFERED A SALARY OF \$8,000.00.

IT WAS ALSO UNANAMOUSLY VOTED THAT IN ORDER TO HAVE SUFFICIENT FUNDS FOR THE VACATED POSITION OF MR. COOMBS AND THE HIRING OF A NEW SANITARIAN, THAT FUNDS FROM THE TB CONTROL FUND, ESTABLISHED IN 1966, BE TRANSFERRED FROM THAT FUND TO ACCOUNT 10-A, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$ 2,250.00.

MENTION WAS MADE OF THE DANGER OF THE SANITARIANS CLIMBING UP ON THE FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR AIR POLLUTION TESTS. DR. ADAIR TOLD THE BOARD THAT HE WOULD SEE THAT THE FIREMEN RELIEVED THE SANITARIANS OF THIS DUTY IF POSSIBLE.

LETTERS OF REGINATION FROM MR. COOMBS AND MR. REICHLER READ TO BOARD.

LETTER FROM THE CLARK COUNTY PLANNING AND ZONING, REGARDING "NO MORE DUMPS" IN CLARK COUNTY, ALSO READ.

DR. ADAIR SAID THAT THERE WERE NOW 6 CONTAMINATED WELLS IN OAK PARK AND THAT HE WOULD MEET THE NEXT DAY WITH MR. EARL HOGAN, INDIANA STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO GET HIS OPINION ON WHAT TO DO. THEY WOULD ALSO MEET WITH THE MEMBERS OF THE OAK PARK CONSERVANCY DIST. AND OAK PARK IMPROVEMENT ASSN.

DR. ROBY SAID THAT HE FELT THAT PAPER PUBLICATION REGARDING THIS, SHOULD BE MADE AT THE PROPER TIME. THIS WAS THE UNANMOUS FEELING OF THE BOARD.

THE CONTAMINATED WATER AT THE JEFFERSONVILLE ELKS CLUB WAS ALSO DISCUSSED AND IT WAS UNANAMOUSLY VOTED TO NOTIFY THE EXALTED RULER OF THE CLUB TO THIS EFFECT, BEFORE MAKING ANY PUBLIC NOTE OF THIS IN THE NEWSPAPER. THE BOARD FELT THAT IT WAS MANDATORY THAT THE JEFF. ELKS CLUB HAVE AN ADEQUATE WATER SUPPLY AND THAT MEMBERS SHOULD RECEIVE LEGAL NOTICE TO THIS EFFECT. SOME SUGGESTIONS WERE MADE THAT THEY HOOK INTO THE SELLERSBURG WATER SYSTEM, BUT NO VOTE.

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH
WAS HELD WED. JULY 1, 1966

PRESENT

MR. MILLER DR. BOWER
DR. ROBY, DR. SPIETH AND MR. BRUMMETT.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER. MINUTES READ AND APPROVED AS READ.

MOTION MADE BY DR. BOWER SECONDED BY DR. ROBY AND ALSO CARRIED; THAT THE CLARK COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT BOARD GO ON RECORD AS UNANIMOUSLY RECOMMENDING TO THE OAK PARK CONSERVANCY DISTRICT THAT THEY (THE OAK PARK CON. DIST.) TAKE IMMEDIATE EMERGENCY STEPS TO SUPPLY AN ADEQUATE WATER SUPPLY TO RESIDENTS OF OAK PARK. ALSO NOT TO GIVE ANY PUBLICITY TO NEWSPAPERS, UNTIL OAK PARK CONSERVANCY HAD A CHANCE TO ACT.

AFTER A GREAT DEAL OF DISCUSSION REGARDING THE PROPOSED DOG POUND, IT WAS AGREED TO TAKE NO ACTION, BUT LET THE COMMISSIONERS HANDLE THIS.

THE 1967 BUDGET FOR THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT DISCUSSED IN DETAIL AND MEMBERS AGREED THAT THE SERVICES OF AN ATTORNEY WOULD BE INVALUABLE. THE BOARD DIRECTED DR. ADAIR TO GET FIGURES ON OTHER HEALTH AGENCIES AND BY ALL MEANS TO TRY TO BRING THE SALARIES OF HEALTH DEPARTMENT UP TO THE STATE AVERAGE INCLUDING HIS OWN SALARY.

DR. ADAIR TOLD THE BOARD THAT DUE TO THE MOVING AND LACK OF SPACE THAT WE HAD NOT HIRED A TB CLERK, BUT IT WAS AGREED THAT WE SHOULD PURCHASE THE NEEDED EQUIPMENT, SINCE IT WAS ALLOWED IN THE BUDGET.

DR. ROBY MOVED AND IT WAS SECONDED BY DR. BRUMMETT, THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE PROPOSED BUDGET AS REVISED.

THE TRASH AND GARBAGE SITUATION THAT HAS RECENTLY BEEN SUCH A PROBLEM, WAS DISCUSSED BY THE BOARD. MR. MILLER STATED THAT HE FELT THAT THE PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION WAS VERY COGNIZANT OF THIS CONDITION AND THAT WE FIND OUT WHEN THE PLANNING AND ZONING MEETINGS WERE HELD AND TO TRY AND SEND SOME REPRESENTATIVE.

DR. ADAIR DISCUSSED THE LINCOLN HEIGHTS SEWER SITUATION, TELLING THE BOARD THAT CLARKSVILLE WAS IN THE PROCESS OF HAVING A COST ANALYSIS MADE TO ENLIGHTEN THE PEOPLE AS TO WHAT IT WOULD COST THEM INDIVIDUALLY. ALL MEMBERS FELT THAT NOTHING FURTHER COULD BE DONE UNTIL THIS HAD BEEN ACCOMPLISHED.

THE AIR POLLUTION SITUATION WAS DISCUSSED AND DR. ADAIR SAID THAT AN ORDINANCE WAS AT PRESENT IN THE HANDS OF THE COUNTY ATTORNEY AND HE FELT EVENTUALLY THAT A BOARD WOULD BE SELECTED AND NO DOUBT BE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

FURTHER DISCUSSING THE LINCOLN HEIGHTS SEWERS, IT WAS FELT THAT AFTER WE HAVE OBTAINED THE SERVICES OF AN ATTORNEY THAT (THE ATTORNEY) COULD GET THIS ORGANIZED.

THIS MEETING WAS DUE TO THE REGINATION OF BOTH SANITARIANS, MR. ARTHUR REICHLER AND MR. CARL J. COOMBS.

A DISCUSSION WAS HELD REGARDING A REPLACEMENT FOR MR. CARL J. COOMBS. MOTION BY DR. BOWER AND SECONDED BY DR. BRUNER AND CARRIED THAT MR. FRED TAYLOR, REGISTERED SANITARIAN FROM JEFFERSON COUNTY, KY. BE CONTACTED AND HE BE OFFERED A SALARY OF \$8,000.00.

IT WAS ALSO UNANAMOUSLY VOTED THAT IN ORDER TO HAVE SUFFICIENT FUNDS FOR THE VACATED POSITION OF MR. COOMBS, IN THE HIRING OF A NEW REGISTERED SANITARIAN, THAT FUNDS FROM THE TB CONTROL FUND, ESTABLISHED IN 1966 BE TRANSFERRED --- IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,250.00. TO --102-A.

MENTION WAS MADE OF THE DANGER OF CLIMBING UP ON THE JEFFERSONVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT FOR AIR POLLUTION TESTS AND DR. ADAIR TOLD THE BOARD THAT HE WOULD TRY TO SEE THAT THE FIREMEN RELIEVED THE SANITARIANS OF THIS DUTY BY DOING IT FOR THEM.

LETTERS OF RESIGNATION FROM MR. COOMBS AND MR. REICHLER- READ TO BOARD. DR. ADAIR ALSO READ LETTER HE HAD SENT TO CLARK COUNTY PLANNING AND ZONING, REGARDING NO MORE DUMPS IN CLARK COUNTY.

DR. ADAIR SAID THAT THERE WERE NO 6 CONTAMINATED WELLS IN OAK PARK AND THAT HE WOULD MEETING THE NEXT DAY WITH MR. EARL HOGAN, INDIANA STATE BOARD OF HEALTH TO GET HIS OPINION OF WHAT TO DO. THEY WOULD ALSO MEET WITH MEMBERS OF THE OAK PARK CONSERVANCY DISTRICT AND OAK PARK IMPROVEMENT ORGANIZATION.

DR. ROBY STATED THAT HE FELT THAT PAPER PUBLICATION OF THIS SHOULD BE MADE AT THE PROPER TIME. THIS WAS THE UNANAMOUS FEELING OF THE BOARD.

MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Sept 1966

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING READ AND APPROVED.

A MOTION MADE BY DR. BOWER, SECONDED BY DR. ROBY AND CARRIED; THAT THE CLARK COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT GO ON RECORD AS UNANAMOUSLY RECOMMENDING TO THE OAK PARK CONSERVANCY DISTRICT THAT THEY (THE OAK PARK CONSERV. DIST.) TAKE IMMEDIATE EMERGENCY STEPS TO SUPPLY AN ADEQUATE WATER SUPPLY TO RESIDENTS OF OAK PARK. ALSO NOT TO GIVE ANY PUBLICITY TO NEWSPAPERS, UNTIL OAK PARK COM. HAD A CHANCE TO ACT.

AFTER A GREAT DEAL OF DISCUSSION REGARDING THE PROPOSED DOG POUND, IT WAS AGREED BY ALL MEMBERS, TO TAKE NO ACTION BUT TO LET THE COMMISSIONERS HANDLE THIS.

THE 1967 BUDGET FOR THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT WAS DISCUSSED IN DETAIL AND MEMBERS AGREED THAT THE SERVICES OF AN ATTORNEY WOULD BE INVALUABLE. THE BOARD DIRECTED DR. ADAIR TO GET FIGURES ON OTHER HEALTH AGENCIES AND BY ALL MEANS TO TRY TO BRING THE SALARIES OF CLARK COUNTY HEALTH DEPT. UP TO THE STATE AVERAGE, THIS TO INCLUDE HIS SALARY ALSO.

DR. ADAIR TOLD THE BOARD THAT DUE TO THE MOVING AND LACK OF SPACE THAT THE HIRING OF A TB. CLERK HAD BEEN DEFERRED, BUT IT WAS UNANAMOUSLY AGREED THAT WE SHOULD PURCHASE THE NEEDED EQUIPMENT WITH THE MONEY ALLOCATED IN THE BUDGET.

DR. ROBY MADE A MOTION, SECONDED BY DR. BRUNER THAT WE FIGURE ALL SALARIES OF HEALTH DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES INCLUDING DR. ADAIR ON THE AVERAGE STATE LEVEL.

IT WAS MOVED BY DR. ROBY AND SECONDED BY MR. BRUMMETT THAT THE BOARD ACCEPT THE PROPOSED BUDGET AS REVISED.

THE TRASH AND GARBAGE SITUATION WAS DISCUSSED. MR. MILLER STATED THAT HE FELT THAT THE PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION WAS VERY COGNIZANT OF THIS CONDITION AND THAT WE SHOULD FIND OUT WHEN THE ZONING MEETING WERE HELD AND TO TRY TO SEND SOME REPRESENTATIVE.

THE LINCOLN HEIGHTS SEWER SITUATION WAS DISCUSSED. DR. ADAIR INFORMED THE BOARD THE CLARKSVILLE WAS IN THE PROCESS OF HAVING A COST ANALYSIS MADE TO ENLIGHTEN THE PEOPLE AS TO WHAT IT WOULD COST THEM INDIVIDUALLY. ALL MEMBERS FELT THAT NOTHING FURTHER COULD BE DONE, UNTIL THIS HAD BEEN DONE.

DR. ADAIR SAID THAT THE AIR-POLLUTION WAS AT PRESENT IN THE HANDS OF THE COUNTY ATTORNEY AND THAT HE FELT EVENTUALLY THAT A BOARD WOULD BE SELECTED FOR THIS AND NO DOUBT BE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT.
